Here's a curiosity for you, thanks to Sandra and some copies of a very old magazine that she wanted to pass on.



The Sphere: An Illustrated Newspaper for the Home, which became The Sphere: The Empire's Illustrated Weekly, was a British newspaper, published weekly from January 1900 until closure of the paper in June 1964. The first issue came out at the height of the Boer War and was a product of that conflict and the public appetite for images. The Sphere covered general news stories from the UK and around the world; many of the overseas news features were reported in detail as the title was targeted at British citizens living in the colonies. This picture, of ski-ers on the slopes, is taken from an issue dated 31st January 1931.

'The Swiss Season is now in full swing,' the article tells us, and St. Moritz is 'universally acknowledged Queen of the Engadin and the most fashionable and cosmopolitan

resort in the country.' On the inside pages the dancer Anna Pavlova has just died and her loss is deeply mourned. Our columnist is 'weak and doddering' from 'this year's brand of 'flu...' but is saved thanks to a novel by Mr. Francis Brett-Young that was 'clearly designed by providence for the victim of 'flu. It is long and strong and comforting and placid.'
